**Mission:** The Quad County Urban League (QCUL) helps secure equal opportunities for all disadvantaged persons and people of color, including African Americans, women and persons with disabilities in DuPage, Kane, Kendall, and Will Counties in Illinois. In FY12 QCUL served the community through social services and advocacy work within two areas of focus: Education & Youth Services and Economic & Workforce Development.

**In FY2012, the Urban League served nearly 4,000\*\* clients and provided over 10,000 services to individuals and families in need.**

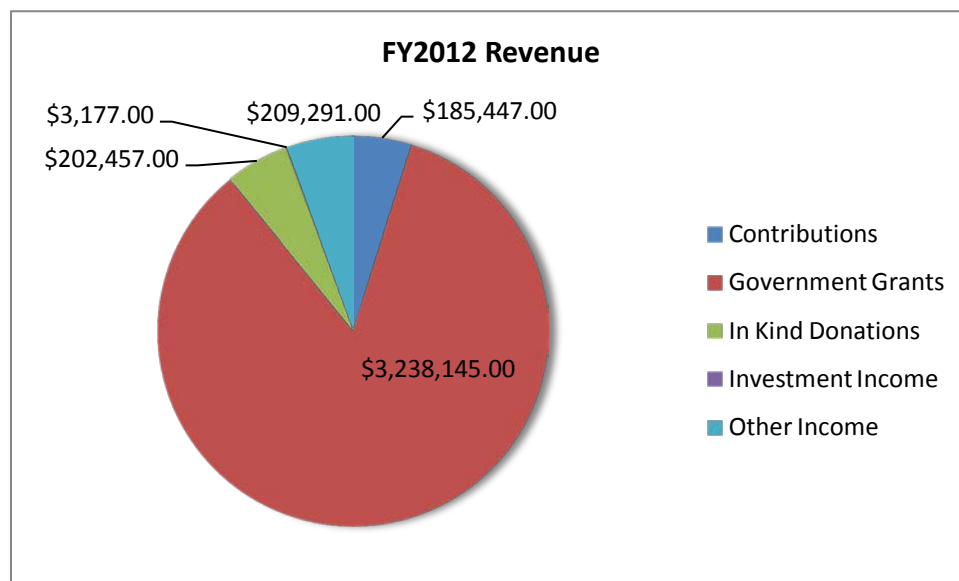
## Economic & Workforce Development Highlights

*Job seekers, both youth and adults can acquire the education and skills needed to gain employment, advance professionally and contribute to the economic growth of their communities.*

	Youth received work experiences and summer jobs.	Youth were given a second chance to turn their lives around through GED preparation and testing classes, job readiness training, and construction rehabilitation community service.	Households gained stability through counseling and/or financial assistance.

	Hours of job readiness services were provided to dislocated workers seeking to return to work.	Youth and adults received services through the Computer Technology Center which offers basic to advanced computer classes and certificates. ## FY 2012 Financial Highlights

- In kind donations increased by 642% between 2011 and 2012
- Overall revenue increased by 49.3% from previous fiscal year
- Fundraising activities increased by 55.7% between 2011 and 2012
